## Background to St. Clare's

### Background to the post

St. Clare's is committed to promoting personal development, education and recreation through student participation in a wide range of activities which complement the academic curriculum. For students on the International Baccalaureate Diploma programme, participation in activities is a formal curriculum requirement (CAS - Creativity, Action and Service), necessary for the award of the IB Diploma.

The Activities Department co-ordinates and runs an extensive programme of activities for St. Clare's IB, Pre-IB and summer course students. The student body is unusually diverse for a College of our size, and changes during the course of the year. IB and Pre-IB students are aged 15–19 and are preparing for university entrance on IB Diploma and Pre-IB courses. Short course students are aged 10-18/19 and attend summer courses on the Banbury Road campus (16+), or at Rye St. Antony School (Junior Course) (10 - 16).

Activities include sporting, outdoor education, cultural, social and service activities. In any one term there would be a range of sporting fixtures, outdoor events (perhaps hillwalking in Wales), theatre and museum visits, one or more overseas trips (perhaps skiing or diving), conservation work and a range of community service. Also featuring might be pottery workshops, an in-house fashion show and an end of term disco. St Clare's has a strong commitment to community service and global citizenship which is reflected in the composition of the activities programme.

The post arises through the resignation of one of our Activities Teachers. The Activities Teacher had particular talents in the area of female sports, though she also contributed to the programme of social events and organised a number of overseas trips. However, it is to be expected that the range of skills and abilities offered by candidates for these positions may differ in many respects from those of the outgoing member of staff.

We wish to continue with the development of the Activities Dept. and expect the successful candidates to play a full role.

The aims are:

- to expand the range and improve the quality of activities offered
- to attune the activities more precisely to the very different interests and needs of the diverse student body
- to attune the activities to the ideals of the College in terms of the promotion of global citizenship, community service and health and fitness
- to encourage greater participation in activities by all students
- to develop further the participation of teaching and other staff in activities with students
- to provide a range of attractive options for students so they will make full and good use of their free time
- to build sporting and cultural links with other schools and colleges through activities
- to promote participation of students in activities, events etc in Oxford.

The dedicated activities team consists currently of three full-time teachers. There is also a large team of visiting activities teachers, including sports coaches, yoga, capoeira and photography. Music teaching is provided by visiting teachers, arranged by the Music Co-ordinator. All permanent teachers are also expected to contribute to activities with students.

Activities are currently arranged on- and off-site. Facilities include art, music and drama rooms,

photography dark room, and a general purpose hall. As our on-site facilities for sports etc are somewhat limited (a consequence of being located in the leafy suburb of North Oxford), we make extensive use of hired and public fields and facilities. Horse riding takes place at stables outside Oxford. Two minibuses and a 9 seater mini-van are available for general College use.

During the summer courses and other vacation courses, activities play a particularly prominent role with an expanded team of temporary activities organisers usually recruited and managed by the Activities Department. .

# **Duties include:**

- to lead a variety of sports and/or outdoor education activities as many as possible!
- to lead cultural, social and other trips, including overnight trips at weekends and more extended trips during holidays
- involvement in offering a range of activities to students e.g. community service, outdoor education, creative activities etc. in addition to the sporting role
- to assist in the administration of the Activities Department office, including being available for advice for students at specified times.
- to direct activities on vacation courses for a minimum of 4 weeks each year
- acting as the CAS Co-ordinator for the college see separate job description

### **Person specification**

### **Essential**

The Activities teacher will:

- be organised and efficient with demonstrable organisational and administrative competence and experience
- have substantial experience of working with people in the 15-19 age group in a relevant context
- have qualifications relevant to directing and leading sports and/or outdoor education and/or other activities
- have expertise and/or experience in a number of relevant activities e.g. sports, Duke of Edinburgh Award, community service
- have experience in the planning and leadership of overseas trips
- have a current, clean driving licence and be able to drive College vehicles (be over 21, and have held a clean driving license for at least three years)
- be an energetic individual with leadership and teambuilding skills who can communicate his/her enthusiasm to staff and students alike

#### **Desirable**

- be a qualified teacher
- international experience
- experience of working in a residential/boarding environment
- experience in context(s) similar to those at St. Clare's, e.g. involvement in IB CAS programme, in a language school or in summer courses.

#### **Terms and Conditions**

Appointment will be dependent upon satisfactory clearance of the necessary Criminal Records Bureau enhanced checks for working with young people.

Working hours for the post will be flexible, and will involve some work at evenings and at weekends. The nature of the post makes it difficult to specify hours, and it is expected that the person appointed will recognise this. A working week of approximately to 40 hours is envisaged. At times e.g. when leading trips, these hours may be exceeded.

The annual leave entitlement will include Christmas, Easter and October half term unless trips are scheduled for those times (time off in lieu will be granted). A commitment to working for 4 weeks on summer courses is required.

The salary for teachers will be according to the St. Clare's salary scale. An extra responsibility allowance may be available for an applicant who also takes on the role of CAS Co-ordinator.

National Teachers' pensions scheme or College's group personal pension scheme. Life cover available either as part of the TPA or for other staff through a separate scheme.

Free meals are available in the College dining room, during working periods, and when a full meal service to staff and students is being offered.

The appointment will be from August 2007.
