Study Abroad at St. Clare's, Oxford

Liberal Arts Programme

The programme is designed to enable visiting undergraduates to have a comprehensive study abroad experience while earning academic credits. Students complete 15 to 18 units of credit. Each course carries 3 units of credit. You are advised to select 5 courses: 4 seminar courses taught in small classes (maximum 12 students) and 1 tutorial class (1-2 students).

St. Clare's academic courses are best described as seminar courses rather than lecture courses. Seminar courses may include an oral presentation by the instructor, but the focus is on active student participation, debate and presentation. We aim to help students to take responsibility for their learning while benefiting from the expertise, support and encouragement of instructors in a shared learning environment with their peers.

St. Clare's tutorial classes are modelled on the Oxford and Cambridge tutorial system; small classes of one or two students meet weekly with the instructor or tutor. The tutorial helps the student to develop writing and presentational skills; this



is where the taught course meets the self-directed independent study. The role of the tutor is to ask questions, stimulate discussion and provide guidance and detailed feedback.

A wide range of subject classes is available within the following disciplines:

It is possible to accommodate special requests through tutorial classes. Recent examples have included Film Adaptation, Jane Austen, British Illustration and the works of Flann O'Brien.

Programme of study for Education Majors

The Education Studies Programme at St. Clare's, Oxford is designed to allow Education majors, licensure students and trainee teachers to study abroad and earn credits toward their degree.

An excellent blend of theory and practice, the programme will enhance your understanding of key issues in education theory, in the UK and internationally, and provide practical experience as a classroom assistant in either a local primary or secondary school. In addition, students enrolled on a full semester programme choose from our menu of Liberal Arts courses to complete a full credit load.
