Your studies will take advantage of the academic and cultural resources of Oxford, London and beyond through **field trips** to Blenheim Palace, the Freud Museum, Shakespeare's Stratford-upon-Avon and other sites.

Classes visit the Oxford University museums and explore the colleges that children's authors from Lewis Carroll, C.S. Lewis and J.R.R. Tolkien to Philip Pullman have made famous – all here in Oxford.

Study Options

You will complete 4 or 5 academic courses – a group of seminars and a tutorial class. **All classes are small.** Seminars typically have 4-10 students; tutorials provide more dedicated support and have 1-3 students.

We offer Education courses to help Liberal Studies, Education and licensure students complete the requirements for their major. Explore key issues in educational theory, policy and practice, both in the UK and internationally, as you draw on the practical experience of your school placement.
